A Reliquary containing a relic of the beloved Clare Fey, foundress of the Sisters of the Poor Child Jesus, will be brought to Southam by Sr Beate OSB from Bernried, Germany. The Reliquary will be placed in a special cabinet (purpose-built by parishioner Peter Watts) in the Olde House Retreat Chapel. The Reliquary will then be brought into Church for a Special Mass on the Feast Day. After Mass a procession with candles will return the Reliquary to the special cabinet in the Olde House Retreat Chapel. Tea/Coffee & Biscuits will be served in the Hall afterwards.
