LEARNING LOGS - By the Students...

MY MUSICAL CIRCUIT BOARD GAME

I made this with my Grandad. He has lots of tools and is a plumber. We talked about the idea in my head. I did not know how or when I was going to make this. I knew I wanted it to be electrical and a game. First of all, we found a piece of wood and two old wired coat hangers, a metal ring, copper pipe, some wire, white oscillators, a doorbell and a switch. We bent the coat hangers and bolted them together, the doorbell was glued to the board, and the positive wire from the doorbell was soldered onto the copper ring. The negative wire was soldered to the bent coat hangers. The circuit is connected when the ring touches the coat hangers. The switch stops it going on and off all the time.

How to play:

- 1. Turn the switch on.
- 2. You start by the switch and try to make it to the other side without the fitting touching the coat hangers.
- 3. If it plays a really long tune you have touched the wire which means you are out.


HELLO STRANGER!
