Our children have come back to school refreshed after their holidays. It has been a lovely autumnal week in school. Children have helped to sweep up the leaves as many have fallen.

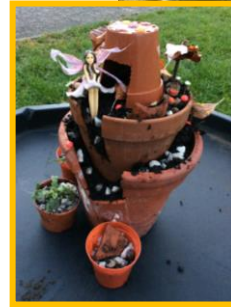
I have been delighted this week to witness many acts of kindness. Children have worked alongside their classmates to facilitate their learning.

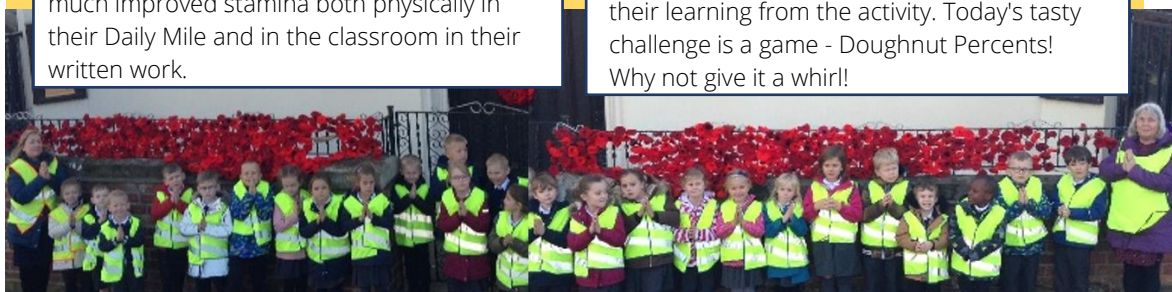


GOLDFINCHES
