ATTENDANCE & COVID

Absence Notifications: Schools are required to continue to provide Track and Trace support throughout the holidays. If your child develops symptoms or tests positive over Christmas, you will still need to contact the school office by email. Because we will need to inform others who may need to isolate, we need to know exactly when symptoms started, or the date of a positive test if asymptomatic. Please put COVID in the email subject heading.

A reminder, that parents must notify the school of any absence. For illness this means phoning or emailing the school office on the first day of absence and then each day thereafter (unless we agree a return date on day one, for example a 48Hr sickness or Covid-19 isolation period). We will contact parents on a daily basis if they fail to inform us of an absence.


