

Finally, look out for the first signs of spring, they are there; I spotted snow drops and some trees with buds on them. A hopeful sign!



FISHY FRIDAY FUN: NATIONAL MARINE AQUARIUM WEEKLY ASSEMBLIES



COVID-19: VACCINE FRAUD





PEOPLE ARE WARNED TO BE ALERT TO THESE SCAMS:

The NHS will:

- NEVER ask for payment the vaccine is free
- NEVER ask for your bank details
- NEVER arrive unannounced at your home to administer the vaccine
- NEVER ask you to prove your identity by sending copies of personal documents such as your passport

STAFF TESTING UPDATE:

From next week, starting the 25th January, we have been asked by the government to have two Lateral Flow tests a week.

The whole staff, including support staff, will take the test and if a positive result comes in then the bubble may have to close if there has been close contact with the staff member. Obviously if the staff member is in a role that means they haven't had close contact with others, then the bubble would not have to close.

Staff will do the tests at home in an evening, so if a bubble has to close we would endeavour to let you know that night via email and update the school website. I have had correspondence with Education Corona and they have said: "After seeking advice from PHE and NHS Test and Trace, the government has decided to suspend the requirement for routine confirmatory PCR for positive LFD results. Under the new system, an LFD result will trigger the legal duty to self-isolate for all close contacts/school bubbles."
