Dear Parents and Carers,

There has been much in the news this week about climate change with the COP26 conference, which we have looked at in school. As nations contend with the complexities of achieving 'net zero', we come back to the simple idea at the heart of our faith, which is to 'Live Simply'. Pope Francis reminds us in 'Laudato Si' about our 'care for the common home'. This reminds us of the need to take swift and unified global action. So, as well as praying and reflecting on God's creation we should aim to do practical things, such as reducing our impact on the planet by reducing, reusing and recycling. We have explained to children that this is a season of waiting; a season of hope and love. Let it be a special time for all families.
