Dear Parents and Carers,

Well what a whirlwind of a second week of term we have had! We have had lots of exciting learning going on across the school and I cannot tell you often enough what a privilege it is for me to see how the children engage and work hard every day. Of course, none of this would be possible without the amazing team of staff we have here at St. Mary's. We have missed the staff and children that have had to isolate due to the dreaded Covid! But we welcome the vast majority back with (virtual) open arms on Monday. Where possible we strive to keep the days and routines as normal as possible and our Skylarks class were here with us virtually for our Celebration Assembly today.

This week we welcome Miss Priestly to the team from Newman University. Miss Priestly is here on her final teaching placement until Easter and she will be working in Year One, alongside Mrs Hawley and Mrs Costa, with our Doves. Give her your welcoming smiles and say hello — I know how much I valued this (and I still do) when I first started here.

Covid The guidance is continually changing and to the right of here is the most current guidance (subject to change). Please keep LFD testing your household and children over 5 to pick up asymptomatic cases and protect the school. If you are unsure about whether to send your child to school then please do call or email the office and we will try to find the answers for you. Alternatively, you can call the NHS on 119 for guidance.

Homework: I will be setting homework challenges each week across the school and I will have a dedicated place in the hall where we will display the children's work.

This week's challenge is about Ordinary Time, our new Liturgical Season. Can you see that my typing below is green? Why have I done this? Ordinary time is the longest Season in our Church, split into 2 parts. During this Season we celebrate Jesus' ministry and we learn about the lives of the followers of Christ, and the Saints whose Feasts happen in this time.

So, your new challenge this week – can you make a poster to show that ordinary time is not ordinary at all but a really special time for us to learn about the life of Christ during his ministry (the time he was teaching and doing miracles). You can share the places Jesus visited, who his Apostles were, what other important characters helped him on his journey, the miracles he performed, the parables he shared... in drawing, writing or any other creative way you can imagine.

This is a big challenge so there will be 2 weeks to do this one and I will reward children who take part on 28th January 2022.

COVID-19 CHANGES

Lateral flow tests are taken by people who do not have COVID-19 symptoms and are a hugely important tool in helping to protect our school community.

From Tuesday 11th January people who receive a positive lateral flow device (LFD) test result will be required to self-isolate immediately and won't be required to take a confirmatory PCR test. This is a temporary measure because while COVID-19 rates remain high across the UK the vast majority of people with positive LFD results can be confident that they have COVID-19.

CAITHOLIC PRIMARY SCH

Anyone who develops 1 of the 3 main COVID-19 symptoms (a new continuous cough / high temperature /a loss of, or change in normal sense of taste or smell) should remain at home and arrangements should be made for them to get an NHS tested. This should be an NHS PCR test taken at a test site. When COVID-19 is circulating, it is worth also being aware of the wider symptoms of COVID-19 including: sore throat, headache, muscle ache, fatigue, shortness of breath, blocked/runny nose, diarrhoea and vomiting, and cold-like symptoms.

Household members of the symptomatic individual who are over 18 years and 6 months and not fully vaccinated, must also stay at home whilst awaiting the PCR result - they should not go to work, school or public areas, even for exercise. Testing can be arranged by ringing 119 or booking online:

Should the PCR yield a positive result, we would ask that you isolate and follow national "Stay at Home" guidance: https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/covid-19-stay-at-home-quidance

As of Monday 17th January, isolation rules will change and people can end their self-isolation after 5 **FULL DAYS**, as long as they test negative on day 5 and day 6 **AND** do not have a temperature.

Our 'Winter Wonderland' topic has continued as we have read more of the 'Emperor's egg' and labelled the parts of a penguin. Well done Robins class, another great week!



DOVES

This week Doves have settled well into our new classroom and routines. They are working hard on our new topic Poles Apart. We have been reading and writing poetry about polar bears and drawing sketches of animals who live in cold places. In Maths we have been learning to subtract by crossing out and counting backwards.

GOLDFINCHES

Goldfinches have been superstar learners this week. We have enjoyed reading Paddington at the palace and using role







play to help sequence the story of events. We have enjoyed starting our new RE unit: Parables and Miracles. We have lots of knowledge about the miracles of Jesus and now we are extending our learning to further stories and understanding the teachings. Our science topic, Animals including humans, has allowed us to look at the similarities and differences of animals' offspring.

KINGFISHERS

We have had another fantastic week in Kingfishers this week! In Maths, we have been focusing on multiplication and division and practicing our times tables. The children have loved learning some of their times tables through listening to the Scratch Garden counting songs. This is something that they can also enjoy at home by typing 'Scratch Garden counting songs' into YouTube. In our English, we have been looking at the Egyptian Tale of 'Horus the Avenger!'.

This week we have used this tale to develop our describing skills and our use of inverted commas. We have also begun to delve into our topic of 'Tomb Raiders!' as this term we are going to be exploring Ancient Egypt. This week, the children were historians and learnt about major moments in Egyptian history and created a timeline. Ask them for a fact they have learnt so far!
