From the Head

Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been very quiet in school this week and it is not a concept that we enjoy. We cannot wait to have all of the children back at school on Monday and to hear their voices and for them to fill the building with fun and laughter again. I am hoping and praying that we are now through the peak of the outbreak and that we can try to get back to our new 'normal' again.

Even though the Government have made changes and relaxed restrictions, Warwickshire Local Authority are updating schools weekly with their own recommendations, as local guidance supersedes national quidance. As you know, we as a school, had returned to keeping classes in bubbles, this will continue until half term as a measure to keep numbers of positive Covid cases down. We will all continue to wear masks in communal spaces and would ask that you continue to do the same when dropping the children off at the start of the day and when you collect them at the end of the day. We will continue to be vigilant with handwashing and the cleaning of the school. We will however return to after school clubs but children will be separated in to their year group bubbles so things will look slightly different. We would ask that you talk to children about this at home and reassure them that, please God, this will only be a temporary measure. These small measures help to mitigate the risk and hopefully allow us to function 'normally' as a school. I know that I can count on you supporting us in following these measures so that we can keep our school family and the wider community safe.

Just a reminder that this is the advice given by Warwickshire Local Authority that we must follow:

- All children (and staff) to have an LFD (Lateral Flow Test) three times a week on a Sunday, Tuesday and Thursday and the results to be recorded on: https://www.gov.uk/report-covid19-result
- If there is a positive case within your household you must all test, using an LFD, daily and record the results as above.
- If the children or any other member of your household show any symptoms, such as those listed in the guidance, then they are taken for a PCR test.

I just wanted to remind any families, that if you need support you can always come and talk to us, we can't always promise to help but we will try to find somebody that can if we can't. If you prefer you can contact the Family Information Service, who offer support in the following areas:

• Finance • Housing • Childcare Provision • Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) • Family Relationships • Health and Wellbeing Services

Robins have been very busy exploring capacity in maths this week. Children at home have been investigating when a container is full or empty, and what language we use to describe this. The children then started using measurements to identify the container that holds the most. It was lovely to see the children using a variety of materials such as

rice, pasta, water, and soil to work out which was the largest container. I am very proud of the home learning this week, so thank you to the

parents for supporting their children's development.

DOVES

Doves have been working hard with their home learning, they have been sending in lots of fantastic examples of work and videos of their excellent reading. In Maths we have been practising comparing number sentence statements. For English we have been practising our writing skills building sentences and using 'and' to extend our sentences. In Geography Doves have been labelling maps to show the continents and the North and South Pole. For PE we have been doing Cosmic Kids Yoga at home, pretending to be penguins.

GOLDFINCHES

Goldfinches have gone from strength to strength this week, both children who are in school and those learning remotely. We have been continuing the develop our knowledge of multiplying and dividing by 2, 5 and 10.
