Learning German is a Lark! 'Wunderbar' work from Year 5 & 6

Oxford University's Language Department have once again invited 9-11 year olds to enter the Oxford German Olympiad Competition.

As this year's theme is The Rhine River, our Skylarks have learned all about which countries 'Der Rhein' flows through, how Carnival is celebrated in many cities along it and all about the barges on it. Then, pupils were invited to enter one of 3 competition categories:

- Drawing & labelling a picture of a barge on the Rhine
- Designing and labelling a costume to attend a Rhine Carnival in Basel (the Basler Fasnacht) or Cologne (the Kölner Karneval)
- Drawing a comic strip of the Rhine and the places it flows through









In the past we have had some pupils achieving Runners-Up and Highly Commended accolades in this national competition, so we have high hopes for this year. The results of the competition will be released in June... fingers crossed!
