
ST MARY'S NEWS



ROBINS

This week in Robin class we created our own Farm Shop. The children have loved taking on the different roles during their imaginary play. The shop has been incredibly busy and needs restocking frequently! We have discussed what the produce is

This week, Doves have been working fantastically on our new topic, Towers and Turrets, all about Castles. We have been learning about mechanisms in Design and Technology to help us design and make our own working castle drawbridges. In Maths we have been working on comparing and representing numbers up to 50. In Science we have been pretending to be Weather Reporters and writing our own seasonal weather reports.

It has been fantastic to have everybody back and well rested. We used our detective skills to investigate some clues for our new topic this term... Seaside Explorers. We have explored our new book in English, The Lighthouse Keepers Lunch. Mr. Grinling is our main character and will be writing a character description soon. In Maths we have started Fractions and have been focusing on whole and half; this meant we got to design a delicious pizza for Mr. Grinling. We improved our map skills by exploring the atlas to find some seaside cities/towns. In RE, we have been focusing our attention on the symbols we find in church during Easter. Please ensure that if you hear your child read the diary is signed, continue to practice spellings and times tables. Thank you for your continued support.

It has been lovely having all of the children back after Easter. I have particularly enjoyed seeing and hearing all about what the children had been up to during their holidays - and it was great to see the fantastic Easter bonnets and gardens that they had created. This half term we are starting a brand-new topic called 'Source to Sea'. The children will be learning all about rivers and the sea. The children really enjoyed learning about the water cycle, so I have a topic challenge for them to create a poster about the water cycle for our classroom. In Maths we are continuing to extend our fractions knowledge and in English we have begun a brand-new text called Oliver and the Seawigs, which the children are loving!
