

ROBINS

Robin class created a story map to retell the Easter Story to a friend. The story map supports the children to talk in full sentences and remember all of the key events. Once the children became familiar with the sentences they added expression which was lovely to hear! Well done Robins.

DOVES

We have had another busy week in Doves. We have started a new unit in Science called 'Plants'. For our lesson this week, we all went for a walk around the school on a mini nature walk, looking to see what types of plants and trees we could see in our environment. The children really enjoyed exploring with tick lists and magnifying glasses and found many different varieties of leaves and flowers which we discussed and looked at in more detail in class.

In Maths, we have started looking at making equal and unequal groups using counters and other objects in class. In RE, we have been learning about St Peter and the important job he and the disciples had after Jesus' death and resurrection.

GOLDFINCHES

Goldfinches have had a fantastic week. In Maths we have been continuing learning fractions, focusing on half and quarters. We have been beginning to find half and quarter of numbers to show off our learning. In topic we explored our local beach, Hunstanton and found some similarities and differences between there and Southam. We had the chance to go to church this week and find the symbols of Easter we have been learning about in the classroom. The children were fantastic and enjoyed taking their learning into the community. In PE we are enjoying being outside in the sunshine while learning cricket skills, focusing on ball control first.

KINGFISHERS

It has been another busy week back at school for Kingfishers and I am so impressed with how hard the children are working. This week we have been practicing our reading skills and have planned a diary entry ready to write next week. After we have finished our diary entries, we are going to place them as a message in a bottle for other children around the school to read so could you please send in small plastic bottles to help us do this. We have also really enjoyed our continued learning of Easter in RE. Next week we are looking forward to delving deeper into our topic.
