# From the Chair of Governors

It is always lovely to welcome the children back in, but this year, even more so with all the changes in school: The summer holiday was an amazingly busy time in school with **£350,000 worth of work** being undertaken on the fabric of the building involving new electrics throughout, upgraded alarm systems, and - especially welcome - new toilet facilities for the younger children and staff! It's hoped that the remainder of the toilets will be upgraded in the not-too-distant future! Huge thanks must go to our cleaning staff, Shirley Burdett and Chris Hearnden, as well as the rest of the staff for the Herculean task of getting the school clean and ready for the children, as over 30 years of dust and dirt had been disturbed as all the ceilings had to come down to install new cabling.

There have also been quite a few additional staff to welcome as well, and they have been helped to settle in by our "old" hands and the children. Mrs Watson has been a great addition to the teaching staff, working in Year 5 class - again someone well known to the school with 2 children in the Juniors. And finally, the Before and After school club now has a manager, Mrs Mucklow, who is planning daily activities and a variety of snacks to enhance our offer to the children. I wish them all a warm welcome and feel sure that they will settle quickly into school life and will help our children to thrive.

It was with sadness that Mrs Lyons shared with me her decision to retire at the beginning of the summer holidays. Whilst at the school she has devoted her time in such a quiet and unassuming way, always willing to help wherever she was needed. Her faith shone through and will be greatly missed particularly by the GIFT group. I wish her a happy retirement with lots of time spent with grandchildren.

We also said goodbye to Ms Ireland as she moves on to other roles. Over the last 18 months she has been at the core of the school, ensuring gates are opened, school is cleaned and children are welcomed. On behalf of the Governors, I would like to thank her for her hard work and wish her well for the future. Interviews are taking place this week to find a replacement Caretaker.

School is always such a busy place, and never more than this term with parents' meetings, Christmas preparation and all that it brings, and the challenge of the dark nights and mornings, cold weather and seasonal illnesses.

Your governing body has reformed at the beginning of this term, as we continue with a full group of 12 governors, which now consists of 2 main committees. These focus on different areas of school - Performance and Standards, and Resources, each meeting termly. These both then feed into the Full Governing Body meeting at the end of each term. A skills audit was undertaken to ensure best fit for Governors on each committee.

It was lovely to walk into school at 6 last night for a Governor meeting, to see face-toface parents' meetings taking place. I know some schools are still undertaking virtual meetings, so thank you to all staff for all that you have done to prepare for these at the end of a busy day of teaching!

This week Year One have been working really hard with counting one more and one less and have had great fun getting to know our new story 'The Elves and the Shoemaker'. #### **Year Two** – Ms Pahnke

Each week Year Two are showcasing themselves more and more. They have shown great enthusiasm in Maths this week finishing our place value topic and starting addition and subtraction. They are trying hard to impress with their mathematical vocabulary. We have been exploring the features of an instruction text and they have planned our own 'How to make a gingerbread man'. In RE, the children have had the opportunity to reflect on the gifts they have been given by God and how they can use them in our community. The children have been fantastic scientists, exploring which materials are waterproof and which are absorbent.

#### **Year Three** – Ms Keith

It has been another busy week in Year 3. In English, we have been writing the fairytale of Little Red Riding Hood and have used some great adjectives in our writing! In Maths, we have been looking at placing numbers to 1,000 on a number line and in RE we have been looking at what happens during Mass. Last week in Science, we loved making our own fossils and this week have had a fantastic time during a time at Ladbroke Church on our rock hunt! Throughout the year we will be looking at different prayers a as a class and we are currently focusing on 'The Angelus' prayer. I have set the children the challenge of creating a poster for our prayer and would like for these to be displayed at school. The weekly homework



#### Year Four & Five - Mrs Hawley & Ms Costa

Another busy week in Year 4/5. In D&T, we have really enjoyed continuing our learning about the Cornish Pasty. We have done some research over the last few lessons about its origin and learnt some interesting facts about how it was made, why it was made and how to spot a genuine Cornish Pasty. We have even learnt where the well-known chant 'Oggie, oggie, oggie' came from and the reason behind it. Year 4 /5 will be able to share this interesting fact with you. In Maths, we have been working hard with numbers up to 10,000 and have also been developing our knowledge and understanding of Roman Numerals. In English, we have continued with our descriptive writing and the children have produced some lovely pieces of writing. In RE this week, we have started looking at the story of Joseph and his brothers and have discussed the reasons why people feel jealously and hatred to others, just as Joseph experienced with his own brothers in the story.

What a fabulous week. The class discovered more about our circulatory system in science and made life size representations - which was at times challenging but with great results.
