### From the Head...

Dear Parents and Carers,

Well what an absolutely fantastic first half term we have all had! I know that I am very bias but our children, families and staff are the best! As a family we have all enjoyed getting to know the children, parents and new staff and to form those positive relationships to ensure we are creating the best learning environments for our children.

With the season of Halloween nearly upon us please take additional care if you are out trick or treating. The clocks also turn back an hour so the evenings now will be much darker and earlier. Please remind your children to continue to be cautious and to continue to not talk to strangers and to protect themselves.

Uniform seems to have taken a big dip, especially PE kits. We have an abundance of uniform floating around the school — so please do label everything with your child's name.

Please encourage the children to read; it is a vital skill, and the more they read, the better their writing becomes, as they are exposed to a plethora of new vocabulary.


# POPPIES WILL BE POPPING UP
