From the Head...

Dear Parents and Carers,

Advent is a time of waiting. It is a time of hope, joy, love and peace. We will, this Sunday, be moving into the third week of Advent, also named as Gaudete Sunday. In church this week Father Arul will light the pink candle to show that we are half way through our Advent season. It reminds us of the joy that the world experienced at the birth of our Saviour, Jesus. In school this week we talked about how we could fully prepare our hearts for the birth of Jesus. The children had a plethora of ideas that would help us all such as: praying more, going to mass, being kind to their friends and family, helping teachers and doing extra special things for their families. WOW! What superstars we have in Year Two. The children made themselves and all of us proud in Tuesday's evening performance of the Wiggly Nativity. They have been showing off their knowledge of India by writing an information text. They have worked well at gathering the information they need and ensuring they are showing their very best handwriting. In Math we have used the base 10 to consolidate our knowledge of addition and subtraction of two 2-digit numbers. Each day we have been opening a door on our Jesse tree as a way of preparing for Advent by journeying through the stories on Jesus's family tree.

We are slowly coming to the end of the Autumn term, but we are still working incredibly hard and have had yet another busy week of learning. In RE we are coming to the end of our Advent unit. In our lessons this week, we have been learning about the Jesse Tree; a Jesse Tree is a bit like an Advent calendar but using a daily Bible story about someone in Jesus' family tree to help us prepare spiritually as we move towards Christmas. We have looking at some of Jesus' ancestors, Jacob, Abraham, Mary and Joseph, and learning about some of the important things they did in their lives. In Maths we have been continuing to perfect our 9 times tables and have learnt a nifty trick to help us remember them easily - ask your child to show you! In English, we have been developing our knowledge of the past tense and singular and plural forms and trying to use these correctly in our writing. Today, as part of our Art lessons we've been making coiled clay pots and can't wait for you to see the finished products!
