

Every Day Counts....

As a school we are increasingly worried about the attendance of some children in school. Children with 90% attendance are missing approximately 20 days of school per year and have an increased risk of falling behind in their learning. Children with less than 85% attendance are missing approximately 6 weeks of the

school year whilst 80% or less equates to at least a day a week making it impossible to keep up with their work and achieve their best. We are currently monitoring all attendance and letters will be sent to families where absence is a cause for concern and a meeting organised with myself to assess the situation. We hope we can work together with families so that attendance is not a barrier to children achieving their best.

From the classroom... NURSERY & RECEPTION - Mrs Finch & Mrs Hilditch

This week we have been reading the text 'The Emperor's Egg'. The children have loved learning all about emperor penguins. The children related the hatching of a penguin chick to our own chicks. We thought we would see if a penguin huddle really does keep you warm.... we can confirm, it does!! The children had great fun getting into huddles to work out where the warmest spot is. We also measured our height in comparison to an emperor penguin. It turns out, we have got a bit more growing to do!

Year One have had a jampacked week this week! We have had so much fun in the swimming pool and are already looking forward to going back in next week. We have begun to write our own adventure stories this week and wow! They have amazed me with their super star writing. In maths, we have had a crack at missing number problems and been working really hard to count backwards from 20 -



perhaps something you can try at home together to consolidate their learning! We conducted our very own climate change experiment this week and looked at how the melting ice caps in the Poles affects the animals and environment - the class were very excited to see it happen in real time. YEAR TWO – Ms Pahnke

What an exciting week! The children have enjoyed having the opportunity to either develop or improve an important skill, swimming. They already cannot wait to swim again next week. Paddington's Picnic was a lovely opportunity for the children to showcase their learning with their family and friends. Thank you to all those who could make it. In Math we have been learning what an array is and



how we can use this to help our learning of multiplication. We have been gathering information on some landmarks of the UK ready for our information text writing. In PE this week we have been including more team games in our ball skills to learn what it takes to be a team player and consider how our parables we have learnt in RE can help us to do this.

YEAR THREE – Ms Keith

It has been a very excitable week, especially having the swimming pool here! The children have loved their time in the pool this week and are looking forward to going in again next week! In Maths, we have been looking at related facts and learning how we can use our knowledge of other times tables to help us solve problems. The children have made great links whilst doing this. In English, we have created our own character and setting descriptions ready to create our own Ice Palace adventure stories next week; the children's imaginations never fail to amaze me, their new characters are fantastic! In our topic lessons, we have written a very persuasive letter to Mrs Collier. After hearing all about our learning, she decided she wanted to move our school next to Mount Etna but don't worry! We have written to her convincing her not to do this. The children can be very persuasive when they are passionate about something! Thank you for all our continued support!

YEAR FOUR & FIVE - Mrs Hawley & Ms Costa

Another busy week done. The children have really enjoyed having the swimming pool in school this week and having some extra lessons outside the classroom. In the classroom we have been working hard as always. In Maths we have moved on to division and have been practising dividing a 2-digit number by a 1. We have also been looking at the bus stop method to help us with working out our answers. We have been learning about standard and non-standard English, looking at when and where we use each. We have been practising rewriting sentences from non-standard form. In RE we have come to the end of our unit Jesus the Light of the World. We have been looking back at some of the important events of Jesus' life that we have covered (Being presented at the Temple, Jesus' Baptism and the Transfiguration of Jesus) and created some lovely posters to show these. On Tuesday it was *Safer Internet Day*. As a class we looked at and discussed the different ways in which we can stay safe when using our own personal electronic devices on the internet and what to do should we feel unsafe.
