
WHEN IT'S OK NOT TO WEAR UNIFORM...

I am most impressed though, with their gorgeous singing voices and bravery in assembly this morning, where they

performed our song about the Alleluia! Well done Year One - already can't wait until next week.

YEAR TWO – Ms Pahnke | Welcome back! It has been lovely to see the children, they have come back refreshed for the summer term. We started the week by recapping and reflecting on the resurrection of Jesus and the symbols of Easter we see used in the church. In Maths we have begin recognising fractions and will be continuing this topic over the next few weeks. We have planned and published a newspaper report on the Great Fire of London. In PE, we have completed our last lesson on Tennis. The children had the opportunity to put their skills into practice by participating in mini tennis matches. Homework and Spellings will continue to be sent home on a Friday and should be completed and handed in by the following Wednesday. Thank you for your continued support.

YEAR THREE - Ms Keith | I hope you all had a lovely Easter but it has been fantastic to have the children back! We've had a very exciting first week back: we loved our trip to St John's Museum where we learnt all about the Anglo-Saxons as 'Saxon Settlers' is this term's topic. The children were amazing representatives of the school and it's always lovely to see them fully immerse themselves into the different activities. The children had to role play



and take themselves back in time. In our magical story box, we discovered; a Viking supermarket receipt, a Viking brooch and a planning permission form. We were told that the Vikings wanted to build a supermarket. We were then given roles and had to debate whether this planning should go ahead. We learned about different artefacts and how the Ango-Saxons lived to help us make this decision. In Maths, we have been looking and unit and non-unit fractions and in RE we have started our Easter unit. We have been looking closely at the story of the Road to Emmaus. Please can I ask that you remind the children bring their reading books and inform me if their book needs changing. Homework will be sent out each Friday and should be returned on a Wednesday. Thank you for your continued support.

YEAR FOUR & FIVE - Mrs Hawley & Ms Costa | This week Year 4/5 have been working hard in RE comparing the story of the Resurrection of Jesus as told by the four Gospels. We looked closely at the details told in each version and the important messages Jesus gives us. In Maths, we have been learning to add and subtract fraction. We have begun our work on our new topic 'Source to Sea. In Geography, we have been learning about the Water Cycle, learning how water evaporates from the sea, through the clouds and falling as rain before returning to the rivers and finally back to the sea.

<code>YEAR FIVE & SIX</code> – Mrs \cdot Banat-Rinz | What a great start to the summer term. The sun is shining and everyone has come back with a thirst for learning. This week in RE we have concentrated on the Easter unit and we have explored the story of Thomas who doubted that Jesus had indeed risen. Everyone wrote amazing speeches as if they were Thomas, persuading others to follow him and spread the Good News. They also produced such fabulous art work linked to it that we have had to turn it into a display on the stairs. We most certainly have a lot of budding artists in the class! In Maths we have been reminding ourselves how to accurately add and subtract with decimals, plus multiplying and dividing with two-digit numbers. It has been wonderful to see how much some children have read over the holidays - a reminder to read every day and bring in your reading book daily! Also keep up with TTRS every day too. I was pleased to see lots of year 6 children attend their SATS booster session this Thursday morning again before the 9th May when they begin. These sessions are really helping, so please remember to send your Year 6 child next Thursday at 8am.
