YEAR FOUR & FIVE - Mrs Hawley & Ms Costa



In Maths, we have been working really hard on perfecting our arithmetic skills in preparation for our upcoming assessments. In English we have started our new story the 'Wind in the Willows.' The children worked together to retell



the story through role play (see photos). We have also been learning about direct speech and the punctuation needed in our writing. The children have practised using this in their own writing and have written some lovely conversations between two of the characters, Ratty and Mole. In Topic we have been learning to do 4 -digit grid references on OS maps of London and the Thames. Year 4 led mass alongside Year 2 yesterday in school and did a fantastic job, as always.
