#### St Mary's Attendance Heroes

Along with your child's report next week, you will receive an attendance certificate confirming their percentage attendance. As we have previously explained in this newsletter, missing even a small amount of school can have a



very detrimental effect on your child's learning. As a school we aim for all children to be at school at least 95% of the time.

A small number of persistently late families are impacting the school's morning routines. Please remember, school gates open at 08:45 and children should be <u>at their desks</u> by 08:55. However, please don't set the alarm too early - children should never be dropped off unattended; if they do arrive before 08:45, we will have to admit them to the Breakfast Club and emergency rates will apply.

#### Phoning the school..

Please note our phone options changed several months ago: Option 1 is Absence, Option 2 is B&A Club (not manned or checked during the school day) Option 3 is the school office.

We need to know when your child is not going to be in school. This must be reported daily by 09:30 either by phone or email to the school office. The office can advise exclusion and return times for common conditions - please remember it must be a **full 48 hours** clear since the last episode of vomiting or diarrhoea before returning.
